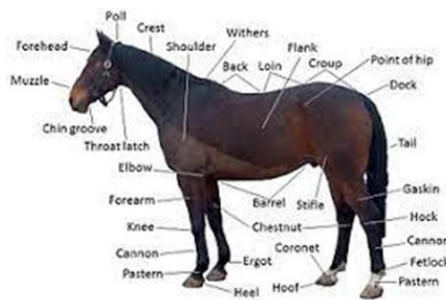
# Spotlight on Writing

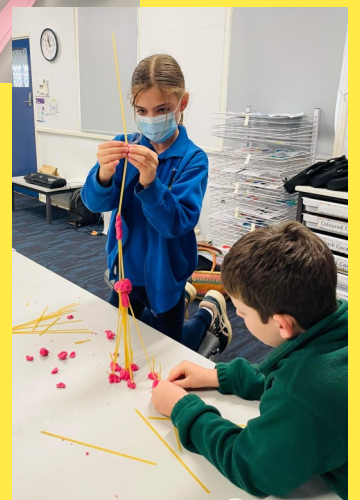

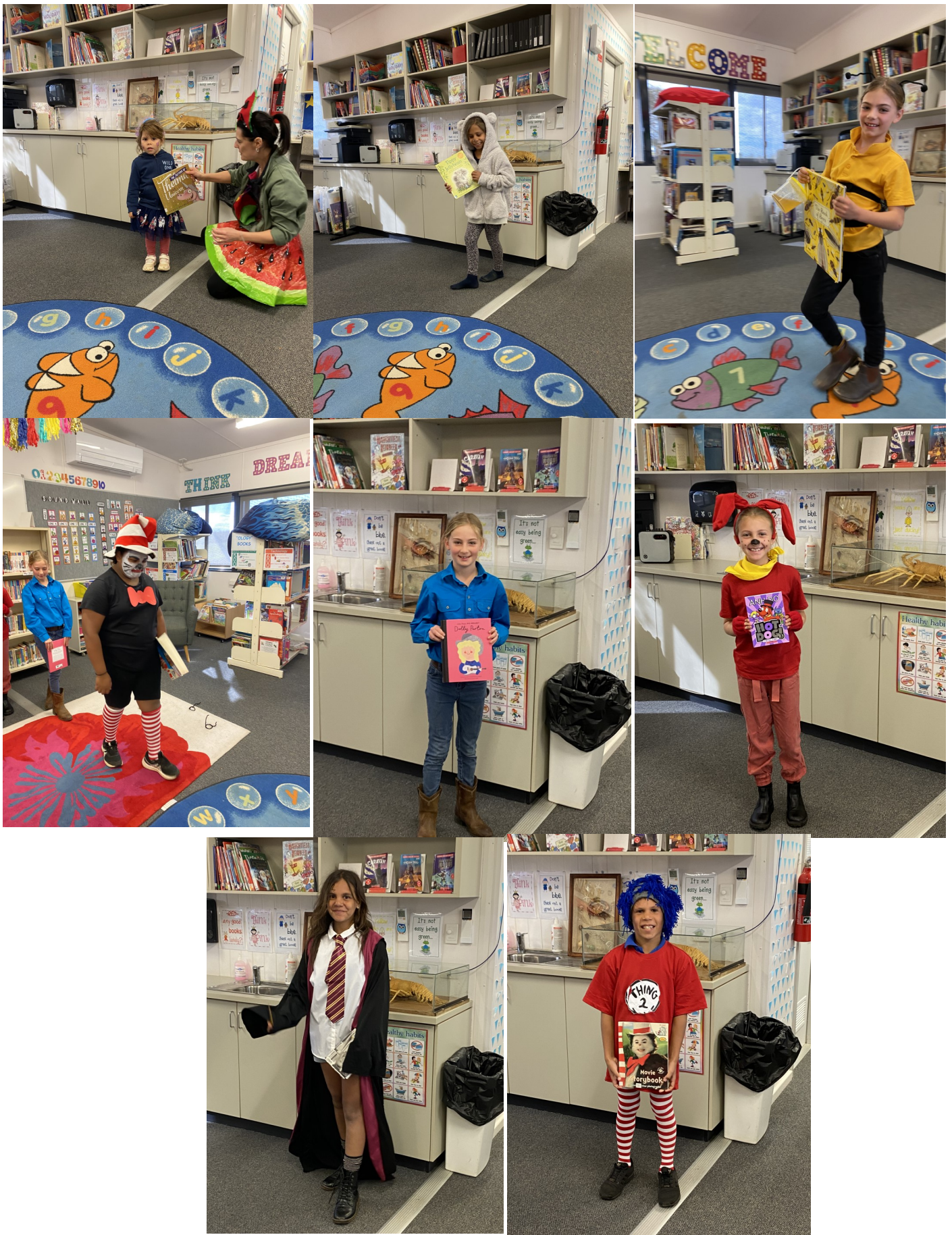
