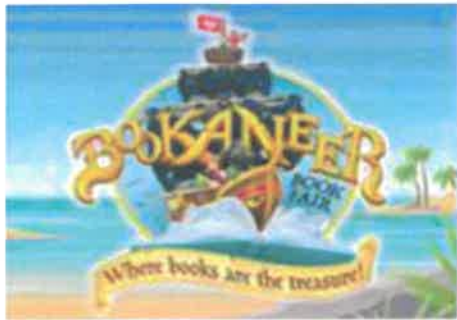

What to do

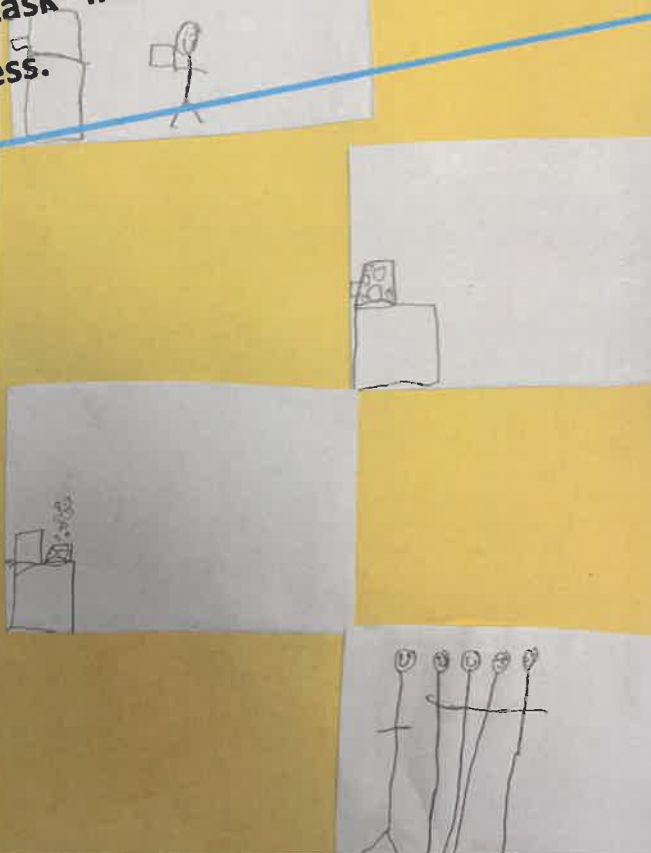
First, put the beans in the machine
